Love is the desire to do good to everyone and everything in the infinitely eternal cosmos.

What is desire?

The conscious impulse toward something that promises enjoyment or satisfaction in its attainment.

What is good?

Something that is true, beautiful, right, loyal, virtuous, etc.

What is the cosmos?

All of the infinitely eternal creation.

Loving leadership

What is leadership? the office or position of a leader; capacity to lead; the act or an instance of leading. What this sphere needs is the exercise of strong *leadership*!

Bearing - the manner in which one behaves or comports oneself; the manner in which one bears oneself.

Courage - mental or moral strength to venture, persevere, and withstand danger, fear, or difficulty.

Decisiveness - having the power or quality of deciding; ability to make a decision.

Dependability - capable of being trusted or depended on; reliable.

Endurance - the ability to withstand hardship or adversity; the ability to sustain a prolonged stressful effort or activity; example, running a marathon; the act or an instance of enduring or suffering; example, life in the flesh.

Enthusiasm - strong excitement of feeling, ardor; something inspiring; zeal or fervor.

Initiative - an introductory step; energy or aptitude displayed in initiation of action, enterprise; acting at one's own discretion independently of outside influence or control.

Integrity - firm adherence to a code of especially moral or artistic values : incorruptability; an unimpaired condition : soundness; the quality or state of being complete or undivided : completeness and universal.

Judgement - the process of forming an opinion or evaluation by discerning and comparing; the capacity for judging; discernment; a divine sentence or decision.

Justice - the maintenance or administration of what is just, especially by the impartial adjustment of conflicting claims or the assignment of merited rewards or punishments; the administration of law; the quality of being just, impartial, or fair; conformity to truth, fact, or reason; righteousness.

Knowledge - the fact or condition of knowing something with familiarity gained through experience or association; acquaintance with or understanding of a science, art, or technique; the circumstance or condition of apprehending truth or fact through reasoning; cognition; the body of truth, information, and principles acquired by humankind; wisdom.

Loyalty - the quality or state or an instance of being loyal; unswerving in allegiance; faithful in allegiance to one's lawful, sovereign government including the cosmic government of God, the Universal Father of all.

Tact - a keen sense of what to do or say in order to maintain good relations with others or avoid offense.

Unselfishness - not selfish; generous; giving; sharing; it is better to give than to receive.

Temperance - moderation in action, thought, or feeling; restraint; habitual moderation in the indulgence of the appetites or passions; moderation in or abstinence from the use of anything intoxicating.

Fortitude - strength of mind that enables a person to encounter danger or bear pain or adversity with courage.

Prudence - the ability to govern and discipline oneself by the use of reason; wisdom in the management of affairs; skill and good judgment in the use of resources; caution or circumspection as to danger or risk.

Tolerance - sympathy or indulgence for beliefs or practices differing from or conflicting with one's own; the act of allowing something; toleration. If we weren't tolerant beings and souls, we wouldn't have much of a diverse and wonderful cosmos now would we?

If someone is lacking in one or more of these traits and "acting" like a leader, they are **NOT** a sincere and true leader. They are an erring **fool!**

Loving teamwork

Everyone and everything serving and working together for the cosmic good; work done by a group lovingly acting together so that each member does a part that contributes to the efficiency of the cosmic whole.

Civilization is in danger when its youth neglect to interest themselves in true, beautiful, and good ethics, sociology, eugenics, philosophy, the fine arts, religion, and cosmology.

Refrain from the mental poisons of hate, anger, fear, envy, jealousy, suspicion, and intolerance.

What are ethics?

The discipline dealing with what is good and bad, right and wrong, and with moral duty and obligation.

What is sociology?

The study of society or the systematic study of the development, structure, interaction, and collective behavior of organized groups of human beings.

What are eugenics?

The practice or advocacy of controlled, selective breeding of human populations to improve the populations' genetic composition.

What is philosophy?

A discipline comprising as its core logic, aesthetics, ethics, metaphysics, and epistemology; the pursuit of wisdom.

What are the fine arts?

Good and beautiful arts (such as paintings, sculptures, or music) concerned primarily with the creation of beautiful objects.

What is religion?

The service and worship of God, the Universal Father of all, and doing His will.

What is cosmology?

The study of the infinitely eternal creation.

The kingdom of heaven is at hand.

By faith in the fatherhood of God you may enter the kingdom of heaven, thus becoming the sons and daughters of God.

Love is the rule of living within the kingdom-supreme devotion to God while loving your neighbor as yourself.
